The registered keepers of the vehicles will receive letters under the Community Speed Watch Scheme.

Please bear in mind that persons who receive Speed Watch letters are **NOT** given the speed that initiated the letter. There is a threshold which is strictly adhered to. When the device is activated the initial speed is that recorded by the operators and not the speed as the vehicle passes the device. The speed captured is that of at least 70 metres prior to the device.

ROAD DEATH IN GREAT KINGSHILL. UPDATE

A 71-year-old man from High Wycombe has been arrested on suspicion of causing death by careless driving and failing to stop at the scene of an accident. He has been released on bail until June 7. Police have also seized a vehicle in connection with the investigation.
